- [s] Situation question: Who said it, and to whom: "You know, my friends, that we receive a good **income** from this business"?
A. Demetrius said it to the craftsmen, along with the workers in related trades (19:25) **
- [g] What did Demetrius and the craftsmen, along with the **workers in related trades** receive?
A. A good income from their business (19:25)
- [g] Where has this fellow Paul convinced and led **astray** large numbers of people?
A. There in Ephesus and in practically the whole province of Asia (19:26)
- [g] In what has this fellow Paul convinced and led **astray** large numbers of people?
A. Ephesus and in practically the whole province of Asia (19:26)
- [g] Whom has this fellow Paul convinced and led **astray**?
A. Large numbers of people (there in Ephesus and in practically the whole province of Asia) (19:26)
- [g] Throughout where is the goddess **herself worshiped**?
A. The province of Asia and the world (19:27)
- [g] What will the temple of the great goddess Artemis be?
A. Discredited (19:27)
- [a] According to Acts chapter 19: verse 28, who were furious when they heard this?
A. The craftsmen and workers in related trades (19:28)

A. When they heard this (19:28)
- [a] According to Acts chapter 19: verse 29, whom did they **seize**?
A. Gaius and Aristarchus (19:29)

A. The city of Ephesus (19:35)

A. Undeniable (19:36)

A. Though they have neither robbed temples nor blasphemed our goddess (19:37)

A. The courts are open and there are proconsuls. They can press charges (19:38) **

A. In danger of being charged with rioting (19:40)

A. Rioting (19:40)

A. Dismissed the assembly (19:41)

A. Sent for the disciples and, after encouraging them, said goodbye and set out for Macedonia (20:1)

A. Paul (20:1) **
- [g] How did Paul travel through that area?
A. Speaking many words of encouragement to the people (20:2)

A. Because some Jews had plotted against him just as he was about to sail for Syria (20:3)

A. Those among whom he has gone about preaching the kingdom (20:25)

A. Innocent of the blood of any of you (20:26)

A. Paul (20:26)

A. "It is more blessed to give than to receive" (20:35)

A. All of them (20:36) **

A. As they embraced Paul and kissed him (20:37)
- [g] Who all **wept** as they **embraced** and **kissed** Paul?
A. The elders of the church (20:37)

A. The ship (20:38)
