- [g] To whom is it no trouble for Paul to write the same things again?A. The Philippians (his brothers and sisters) (P3:1)
- [x] Complete, in essence, the verse that contains the unique word "mutilators."A. "Watch out for those dogs, those evildoers, those mutilators of the flesh" (P3:2)
- [g] Who are dogs?A. Those evildoers (OR mutilators of the flesh) (P3:2)
- [a] According to Philippians chapter 3: verse 3, what are we?
 A. The circumcision (P3:3) **
- [g] By whom do we serve God? A. His Spirit (P3:3) **
- [g] Who serve God by his Spirit?A. We who are the circumcision, who boast in Christ Jesus, and who put no confidence in the flesh (P3:3)
- [a] According to Philippians chapter 3: verse 4, what does Paul have?A. Reasons for such confidence (P3:4)
- [g] How was Paul a Pharisee? A. In regard to the law (P3:5)
- [g] Who was a Pharisee in regard to the law? A. Paul (P3:5)
- [g] In regard to what was Paul a Pharisee? A. The law (P3:5)
- [g] What was Paul as for zeal? A. Persecuting the church (P3:6)
- [g] What was Paul as for righteousness based on the law?A. Faultless (P3:6)
- [g] For what does Paul now consider whatever were gains to him loss?A. The sake of Christ (P3:7)
- [g] What does Paul consider everything?A. A loss because of the surpassing worth of knowing Christ Jesus his Lord (P3:8)
- [x] Two-part question: What does Paul consider garbage, and why?A. 1) All things, and 2) that he may gain Christ (P3:8)
- [g] What does Paul consider all things? A. Garbage (P3:8)
- [a] According to Philippians chapter 3: verse 9, what may Paul be?A. Found in him (Christ) (P3:9)
- [g] Through what is the righteousness that comes from God on the basis of faith?A. Faith in Christ (P3:9)
- [b] In what book and chapter is the following: "I want to know Christ--yes to know the power of his resurrection and participation in his sufferings, becoming like him in his death"?A. Philippians 3 (P3:10)
- [g] In what does Paul want to know the participation?A. Christ's sufferings (P3:10)
- [g] Why does Paul want to know Christ and the power of his resurrection and the participation in his sufferings, becoming like him in his death?
 A So somehow attaining to the resurrection from the dead (P3:10, 11)
 - A. So, somehow, attaining to the resurrection from the dead (P3:10-11)
- [g] What has Paul not already obtained? A. All this (P3:12)

- [g] What does Paul not consider himself?
 - A. Yet to have taken hold of it (that for which Christ Jesus took hold of him) (P3:13)
- [g] What one thing does Paul do?
 - A. Forgetting what is behind and straining toward what is ahead, he presses on toward the goal to win the prize for which God has called him heavenward in Christ Jesus (P3:13-14)
- [a] According to Philippians chapter 3: verse 14, why does Paul press on?A. To win the prize for which God has called him heavenward in Christ Jesus (P3:14)
- [g] Where has God called Paul? A. Heavenward (P3:14)
- [x] Complete, in essence, the verse that contains the unique word "heavenward."
 A. "I press on toward the goal to win the prize for which God has called me heavenward in Christ Jesus." (P3:14)
- [g] What should all of us, then, who are mature take?A. Such a view of things (P3:15)
- [g] What will God make clear to you if on some point you think differently?A. That too (P3:15)
- [a] According to Philippians chapter 3: verse 16, how should we live?A. Up to what we have already attained (P3:16)
- [a] According to Philippians chapter 3: verse 17, what should you do?A. Join together in following Paul's example, and keep your eyes on those who live as they do. (P3:17)
- [g] How does Paul tell you again that many live as enemies of the cross of Christ?A. Even with tears (P3:18)
- [g] As what do many live?A. Enemies of the cross of Christ (P3:18)
- [g] Whose destiny is destruction?A. Enemies of the cross of Christ (P3:19)
- [g] What is set on earthy things?A. Their (enemies of the cross of Christ) mind (P3:19)
- [g] In what is their glory?A. Their (enemies of the cross of Christ) shame (P3:19)
- [g] Where is their mind set? A. On earthly things (P3:19)
- [x] Complete, in essence, the verse that contains the unique word "destiny."
 A. "Their destiny is destruction, their god is their stomach, and their glory is in their shame. Their mind is set on earthly things" (P3:19)
- [g] Where is our citizenship? A. In heaven (P3:20) **
- [g] From where do we eagerly await a Savior? A. Heaven (P3:20) **
